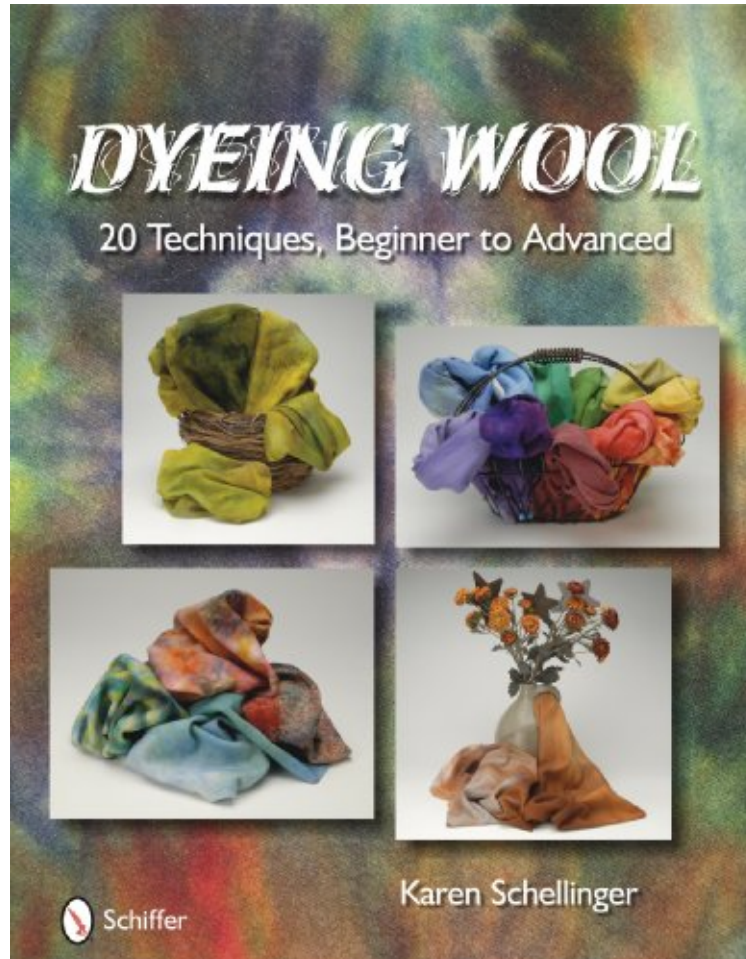

The photos and text are near perfect, so easy to follow the directions. And I love the introductory chapters which not only explain the basics but answer the WHY questions - I found information here never given in other books. Well worth reading over and

over again. At first, I was a bit confused by the way the chapters were organized by color since they really have nothing to do with a specific color . . . each chapter concentrates on a different type of technique, like pan dyeing, spot dyeing, shibori, etc. And she gives you her formulas (Prochem) for most of the samples pictured.
