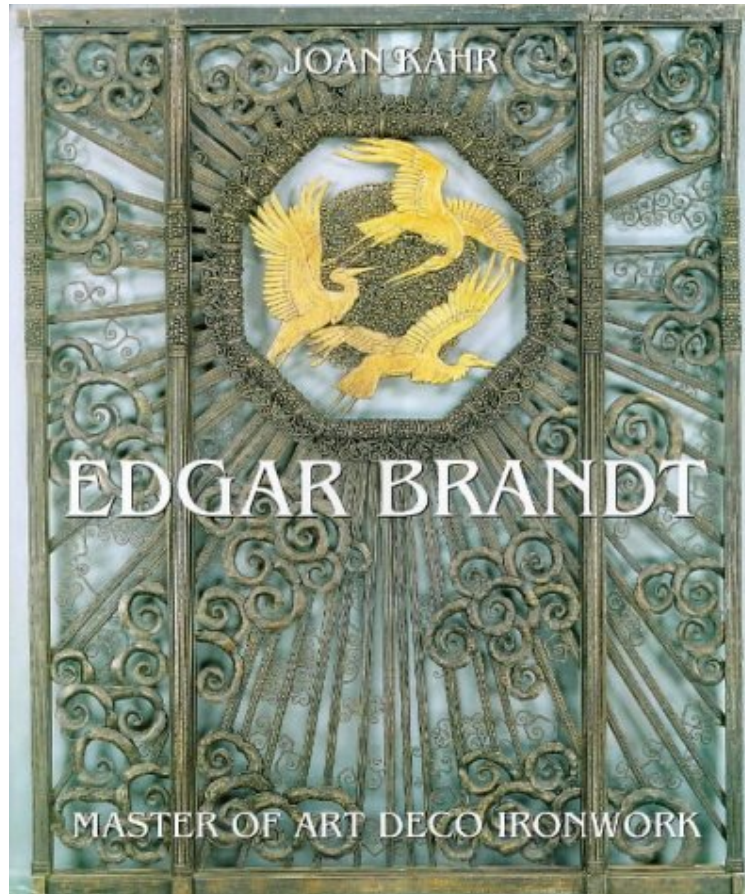

Text covers Brandt's personal history from early blacksmithing, his weapons engineering during WWI, to his influence on ornamentation in the US art deco movement. Most valuable aspect though is the collection of photographs. It is the largest single collection of photo documentation of Brandt's work that I have been able to find. It covers decorative-arts type items all the way to architectural projects.
