These flowers are not really the type that I was expecting, but they are very pretty. They are more on the down home country home dcor type flowers and you can make them pretty quickly. You could add them to practically anything that you wanted to "pretty" up. You could make your own 3d bouquet as shown on the cover with the fabric flowers in the pitcher. It is a good basic book on how to make 3 d flowers, I suppose if you used different fabrics you could dress them up from the country dcor to a more sophisticated theme, like if you use silk or silk sari, or wool or wool felt, or you could even use some nice organza or mylar even, you would have to make sure the mylar was really secure around the edges though.
