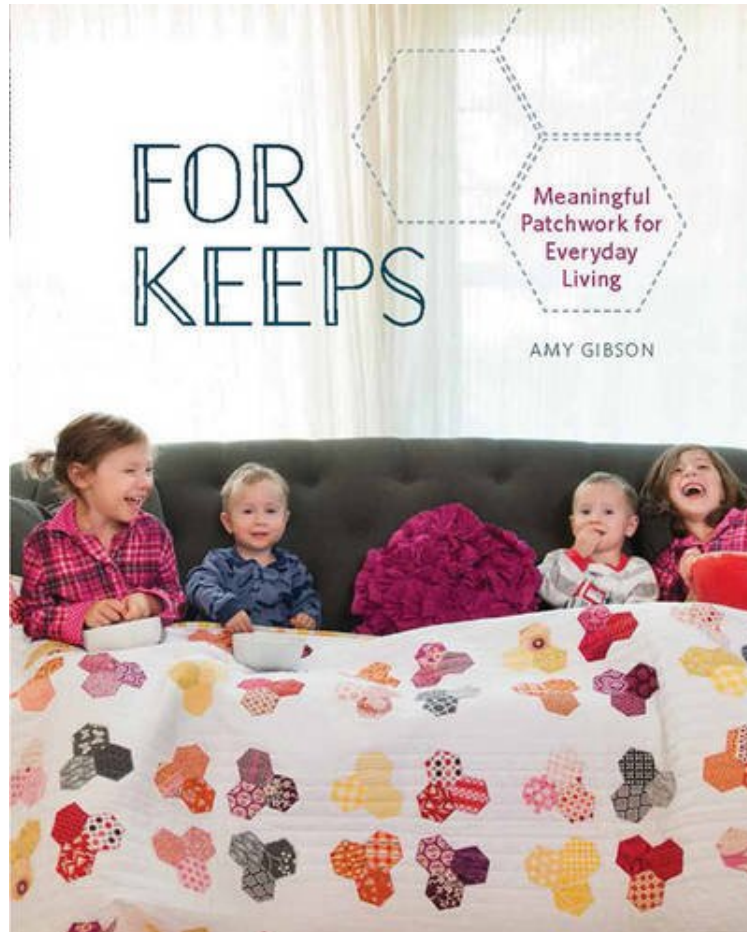

June 2016 The first section is a sound introduction to patchwork and quilting. It covers everything from choosing a machine to walking foot and free motion quilting. There are some unusual tips, e.g. using a thin line of washable school glue to secure seams instead of pins. The 16 projects cover many techniques including hexagons, foundation piecing and applique. There are playmats (one has small bean bags) bags, a book cover and a memory quilt of family photos. One quilt includes antique handkerchiefs.
